#### **FROM PASTOR ERIC**

How do any of us know that we are on the right path? It almost feels like a safe rule of thumb these days that the more certain someone is of their own correctness the less likely that is to be true. And yet, at the same time, so many are entirely assured of just this thing. When this is coupled with the belief that one's opponents are entirely in the wrong, what chance is there for finding the truth with one another?

I have been turning to Psalm 36 with great frequency in recent days. Verse 2 offers such a painfully damning assessment of human nature that I can't help but be cut by it — "In the eyes of the sinful they flatter themselves too much to detect or hate their sin." Within any remotely honest Christian assessment of the self, we are all sinners. Regardless of our status in Christ, we all run the risk of justifying our own behavior—of baptizing our sin since, in our assessment, we are ultimately "good people." But isn't this just self-flattery? Isn't it a tad naive to assume that God agrees with everything we do? God doesn't sanctify the excuses we make for our bad behavior.

However, we are not a people without hope, as God's *love reaches to the heavens;* God's *faithfulness stretches to the skies;* God's *righteousness is higher than the mountains;* God's *justice is greater than the deeps.* We are a fallen people (to be sure), but that doesn't mean that we need to continue in the all-too-human course of self-justification. Because of God's character and work in the world, we are afforded the chance to be truly exposed to ourselves—to see who we really are and be given the chance to be transformed. As the psalmist powerfully avers in verse 9, "in your light we see light." Because of who God is, we see who we are. God reveals all that has been hidden. And once we've finally seen the truth, we might discern what it is we need to change.

This fall will not simply be a season of harvest arboreal color; this will be an autumn of discord and division. We will all need honed spiritual sight this season to properly discern the events around us and to properly see ourselves within them. So, allow for your eyes to see what God is making known. Allow for yourself to come into contact with God's love, faithfulness, righteousness, and justice... and then be changed. Ours is a God who would have us be in the light, so let us see our God and look upon the light into which our God invites us to enter.
