FROM PASTOR ERIC

"And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching." Hebrews 10:24-25

One of the things that I find so compelling about the Bible is how unapologetically it walks the balance between being gruelingly aspirational and unapologetically realistic. It tells real stories about human lives in all of our failures while also affording vision and direction for all the good that we're capable of. Peter both denies knowing Jesus and goes on to lead the church. Mary the sister of Martha both questions Jesus' motives and sacrifices a valuable possession to give him honor. Our Scriptures hold both aspects of life together, recognizing that caricature will never tell the whole truth.

In the letter that we've come to describe as being written to the Hebrews, the unknown author gives a wildly aspirational command to *provoke one another to love and good deeds*. It is challenging enough to drive ourselves as individuals to continue in love and act in good ways for others, so how can we possibly *provoke* people to this lofty end? I would suggest that the author provides a possible path towards this provocation through something very mundane: *spend time with one another*. It's not glamorous, nor does it sound revolutionary, but that's precisely what our Scriptures command. Make it a habit to spend time with the people who make up the body of the church.

As someone new here, that's exactly what I'd like to do as we work our way towards the lofty Scriptural goal of working love and good deeds: **I** want to meet with you. Before the end of the year, I'd like to make the effort to meet with each of you, regardless of whether that's in your home, the church, a coffee shop, or wherever. So let me know what works for you, and we will get a time on the calendar for us to spend some time with one another.

Who knows, we may just provoke one another to practice love and work for the good.




New Books in the Library

From Budget Committee (Brad Leiding)

- Profinium has asked if there are specific items that are being purchased with dollars provided to the church of approximately \$2,500. Youth initiatives at the church were identified as priority needs. Motion by Lynn Kuechle, seconded by Nora Henry for donation to be directed to Faith Formation. Passed unanimously.
- Moving costs to Minnesota were higher than the initial quote received by the Garners. Motion by Paul Peterson, seconded by Sophie Hoiseth for FPC to cover all moving costs. Passed unanimously.
- On behalf of FPC, Nancy Zallek has submitted a \$16,000, grant proposal to a Madelia church for Connections Shelter.
- Specific information related to the Marcia Chalgren estate will be shared as it becomes available, likely towards the end of the calendar year.
- A refund from State Farm Insurance for overpayment has been received and put in the General Fund.
- Motion by Brad Leiding, seconded by Jim Connors to amend the Payment Policy to reflect new rates and adjusted organist rate to \$300. Passed unanimously.
