FROM PASTOR ERIC

In the season of Advent, it is not uncommon to initiate our hope of Christ's presence with the fifth verse of Luke's Gospel, in which we situate ourselves in the historical setting of the late First Century BCE. Herod the Great rules in Judea; Tiberius Caesar is normalizing imperial rule in Rome; and two humble Jews—who might be forgotten to history—grapple with the social realities of aging without a child. This collision of the historic and the personal is how we're ushered into Advent and asked to discern the arrival of God in our midst.

We are also a people whose lives encompass the personal and the monumental. We live with eyes looking outward into the events of our culture and the world beyond. We are asked to reconcile the everyday occurrence of how we live with the broader consequence of actions taken by our leaders and those with power and influence. Where is God arriving in the midst today's collision between the personal and the global?

With those concerns in mind, let's take a step back and consider four verses of Luke's Gospel that we rarely discuss in the Advent season. Rather than starting with a tale about Elizabeth and Zechariah, Luke instead addresses a friend, telling him:

Since many have undertaken to set down an orderly account of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as they were handed on to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, I too decided, after investigating everything carefully from the very first, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may know the truth concerning the things about which you have been instructed.

Luke did not witness the events of Jesus' life, but rather had people tell him stories about focus of his hope. This cultivated a desire to learn more, leading him to interview eyewitnesses and investigate all that he was told. And finally he did his best to lay out an account of Jesus' work in an order that he wanted to share with others.

Much like how we can find kinship with Elizabeth and Zechariah at the start of Advent—looking for ways to reconcile the personal and the global—so too are we like Luke:

...we are trying to make sense of our hope through what we've learned from others. We cannot prove the stories of Advent about Jesus' arrival as a fulfillment of God's desire to be with us and known by us, but we can cultivate a kind of knowing that is more powerful than proof: *love*. It is love of Christ, love of our family, love of the world that compels us believe that God desires to be present with us.

If we love the goodness of this beautiful world, then how could God not love it all the more? If we yearn to see a reconciliation between the struggles of individual lives and power-hungry rulers, then surely God is even more passionate to see the world put to rights. Advent is our annual reminder that our longing for hope, peace, joy, and love are direct outgrowths of God's plans for both the personal and universal needs of all people. Jesus is arriving to begin this work, which continues with him being born in us each year.

And so, as we begin this Advent season, may we all continue the good work of looking wholeness in our personal lives and in the larger events of the world around us. May we come to love Christ more as he brings light to the darkness.




